GENERAL REGULATIONS, HORTICULTURE

1. The show will be governed by the standard Rules and regulations of the American Rose Society. The 2010 Buyer's Guide, Modern Roses, and supplements to the American Rose will be used. The Judges' decisions will be final.
2. All entries will be tagged with the standard entry tags showing exhibitor's name, address, correct name(s) of the variety(ies) and Class. This information is required on both top and bottom sections of the tag.
3. Entries will be made Saturday, September 11 from 7:30 AM to 11:00 AM at the Bidwell Training Center. Judging will begin at 11:15 AM.
4. All entries must be grown by the exhibitor in a private outdoor garden.
5. All containers are supplied, unless otherwise noted. Use of any transparent material to position a specimen in a container is permitted and should be provided by the exhibitor. This wedge must not extend above the top of the container.
6. Specimen blooms of Hybrid Teas, Floribundas, Miniature and Grandifloras must be entered without side buds. Side buds will disqualify an entry in those classes.
7. Sprays of Floribundas, Grandifloras, and Hybrid Teas, etc. will be exhibited as naturally grown, grooming allowed, consistent with American Rose Society Rules.
8. No more than one person (or couple) may exhibit from the same garden.
9. Points toward sweepstakes for both maxi and mini sweepstakes will be:  
(3) Blue Ribbon, (2) Red Ribbon, (1) Yellow Ribbon, (4) Queen of Show,  
(3) King of Show, (2) Princess of Show, (1) Prince of Show.
10. Only one entry per exhibitor is permitted in Challenge Classes I through XIV. In Challenge Class XV (Judges Class), entries will be limited to four entries per exhibitor per type of rose specified (ie HT, GR, Mini ). Multiple entries are permitted in all other classes as long as each entry is a different named variety.

11. All entries become the property of the Pittsburgh Rose Society. No entries may be removed by the exhibitor prior to the close of the show on September 11.
12. Each Keeper Trophy becomes the property of its winner. Perpetual Trophies will be returned in 2011 to the Trophy Chairman on request. Only members of the Pittsburgh Rose Society are eligible to receive perpetual trophies.
13. Trophies will be awarded only to Blue Ribbon winners except for the Color Classes in the Royal Court as noted in the Trophy Schedule.

Challenge Class II 1 Hybrid Tea specimen bloom, 1 Grandiflora specimen bloom, & 1 Floribunda Spray, exhibition stage, separate vases.	Keeper Trophy
Challenge Class III 6 or more Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora specimen blooms in 1 vase. Vase supplied by the exhibitor. Bloom varieties need not be named.	Keeper Trophy
Challenge Class IV 1 bud, 1 exhibition stage bloom and 1 open bloom, stamens showing. All of the same variety, Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, in 1 vase.	Keeper Trophy
Challenge Class V 6 or more Miniature specimen blooms, exhibition stage in exhibitor's vase.	Gioia Perpetual Trophy
Challenge Class VI 3 Miniatures or Mini-Flora 1 variety, 1 bud (sepals down), 1 exhibition stage, and 1 open bloom (stamens showing), in 1 container.	Keeper Trophy
Challenge Class VII—Margaret B. Larson Memorial Trophy 2 Mini-Floras, 1 variety and 4 Miniatures, 2 varieties (2 and 2), exhibition stage, separate containers. Entry should be grouped with mini florals side by side and the 4 miniatures side by side placed in front of the mini florals.	Perpetual & Keeper Trophy

## HORTICULTURAL CLASSES

All roses in these Classes will be entered and judged alphabetically. Subclasses will be established for each variety from A to Z.

- Class 1 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, one exhibition bloom, no side buds.  
Entries to be placed alphabetically within color groups.
- A. White
  - B. Yellow, Yellow Blend
  - C. Orange, Orange Blend, Orange Red & Orange Pink
  - D. Pink, Pink Blend
  - E. Red, Red Blend
  - F. Mauve, Mauve Blend & Russet
  - G. Apricot, Apricot Blend
- Class 2 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, one spray, two or more exhibition blooms per stem, side buds permitted.
- Class 3 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, three specimen blooms, exhibition stage, same variety, one vase supplied by the Rose Society.
- Class 4 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, three specimen blooms, exhibition stage, different varieties, one color, one vase supplied by the Rose Society.
- Class 5 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, one specimen open bloom, more than 3/4 open, stamens showing.
- Class 6 Floribunda, one spray, two or more blooms per stem.

## HORTICULTURAL CLASSES continued

- Class 7 Floribunda, one exhibition bloom, no side buds.
- Class 8 All other types of roses, one bloom or one spray.
- A. Shrub Roses
  - B. Climbing Roses
  - C. Old Garden Roses
  - D. Polyanthas
  - E. Any other roses (Including named unregistered roses)
- Class 9 Miniature Rose, one exhibition bloom, no side buds.
- Class 10 Mini-Flora Rose, one exhibition bloom, no side buds
- Class 11 Miniature or Mini-Flora, one specimen open bloom, more than 3/4 open, stamens showing.
- Class 12 Miniature or Mini-Flora, one spray, two or more blooms per stem.
- Class 13 Miniature or Mini-Flora, three exhibition blooms, same variety, one container supplied by the Rose Society.
- Class 14 Miniature or Mini-Flora, three exhibition blooms, different varieties, same color, one container supplied by the Rose Society.
- Class 15 Novice Class. Limited to exhibitors who have successfully avoided winning a blue ribbon at a rose show.
- A. Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, one exhibition bloom.
  - B. Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, one specimen open bloom.
  - C. Miniature or Mini-Flora Rose, one exhibition bloom.
- Class 16 Most Fragrant Rose - entry may be any rose at any stage.
